Piedras Blancas Light Station Association Minutes from Board Meeting RaboBank, Main Street, Cambria, CA April 24, 2013

Jack Morehead called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Announcements: Jack Morehead welcomed David Cooper as a new board member after his confirmation vote via email by the members.

Approval of the Agenda: Agenda was approved. **Reports:**

- 1. Secretary Report Jim Harris previously emailed a copy of the minutes of March 27, 2013 for review. *M/S/P Minutes of March 27*, 2013 approved.
- 2. Financial Status and Treasurer's Report Fred Apitz distributed his report with the emailed agenda for this meeting for review prior to the meeting. It was agreed by the board without objection that in the future the Treasurer's Report will not provide the monthly Profit and Loss data on a spreadsheet, rather the data will be provided using the standard report format, as provided by Quicken. A form 990 within the Federal and State income tax package was distributed to the board members via email for their review. PBLSA members indicated that they have reviewed the form 990 and approve the data included. By consensus, Holly Gant, Webmaster, is directed to post the submitted form 990 on the PBLSA website for public access. Included in Appendix A is an addendum to the Treasurer's Report that was distributed at the meeting that documents an investment recommendation of the Finance Committee. The recommendation is to move about \$45K from the \$53K Fidelity conservative bond funds to three growth funds. M/S/P The investment recommendation documented in Appendix A is approved. M/S/P Treasurer's Report of April 24, 2013 approved.
- 3. Gift Shop Report Jim Boucher reported in lieu of Carole Adams, and distributed a monthly summary of gift shop sales for the last two years, which is presented in Appendix B. There has been a significant increase in sales over the last year. Holly Gant stated that the gift shop operation is running smoothly under the leadership Carole Adams and therefore, with concurrence from the board members, she announced that she withdraws from the gift shop committee.
- 4. BLM Update Jim Boucher presented the April 24, 2013 BLM report that was previously presented with the agenda for the meeting, and is contained in Appendix C. Jim Boucher stated that Bishops Peak and Teach school will be the last 4th grade educational outreach event this year due to their supporting the field trip with a private donation. In addition, it appears that the sequestration will have more local control, which will lessen its impact on the PBLSONA. In response to a request from BLM for a \$5000 loan from PBLSA funds that was approved via email by the board, the following motion was passed: M/S/P In response to a request by the BLM via Jim Boucher, the PBLSA agrees to provide a no interest loan not to exceed \$5000 to the BLM to cover intern costs in the BLM office.
- 5. Website Development Holly Gant announced that the PBLSA Facebook site has over 100 friends. Holly presented the proposal, refer to Appendix D, to sell selected gift shop items on the PBLSA webpage. After discussion adding the following considerations: the financial report will treat the online gift shop as a separate account from the gift shop account, the price will include shipping and handling which will be adjusted as appropriate, and the items purchased online will be provided by the gift shop inventory and the gift shop will motion was passed.

 M/S/P The PBLSA approves the Online Gift Shop Proposal with the clarifications identified in the discussion above.

- 6. PBLSA Events Jim Boucher distributed the program for the California Central Coast Lighthouse Conference 2013 for the events on April 27-28, 2013. He also noted the plans for the Life at the Lighthouse Cottage tour on Sunday June 2, 2013 are in place for 5 tours that day.
- 7. Grants Jim Boucher reported that there are two outstanding federal proposals for the California coastal trail and plant rehabilitation for the PBLSONA. Jim Boucher is working with the California Parks and Recreation and others on the plans for the California Coastal Trail that will be implemented from the Piedras Blancas Motel to the Elephant Seals site (approximately 3 miles) on the PBLSONA.
- **8.** Membership Tim Postiff reported that Holly is making progress on getting the membership renewal automated.

Treasurer's Report Addendum

Investment Recommendation

The Finance Council met yesterday, April 23, 2013, we had a conference call with Jeff Avila of Fidelity. Considering that interest rates will eventually go back up (estimated to occur in 2015) we asked Jeff for recommendation in anticipation of his event.

IVV (an index fund for S&P 500) \$30,00 dollar cost averaged over 3 month a \$10,000 each.

DVY (an index fund of Dow Jones selected dividend stocks) \$10,000 dollar cost averaged over 2 month at \$5,000 each.

BRK/B (a publicly owned investment manager led by Warren Buffet) \$5,000 lumped sum

Neither IVV nor DVY incur a brokerage fee, therefore no disadvantage to buy over time, BRK/B has gthe normal fee of \$7.95 per trade.

BLM Update 04/24/2013

Communication Tower – Wellsona Iron & Engineering is assembling the wood members at their yard in Paso Robles. Additional lumber has been purchased to supplement the recycled lumber. Replica tanks are being fabricated by Peabody Engineering, Corona, CA.

Fog Signal Bldg. Foundation –The project is being advertised for competitive bid through the government FedBizOpps web site. Anticipate the project to take place July/August.

CA Coastal Trail Segment- Engineers from Trails Unlimited (Forest Service Enterprise) were on site 4/19 & 4/20 to design and draft wetland crossings. A land use permit and CEQA procedures being pursued.

Potable Water- Geohydrologist Tim Cleath has finished the water availability survey. Desalination and a sea water well looks to be the most attractive alternative.

Brick Pathway Project – To date all engraved bricks (43) have been placed. An additional 20+ bricks will be placed once engraving is complete.

Educational Outreach –Baywood Elementary School will visit 4/24 and conclude the funded educational outreach program for this school year.

Calf/Cow Whale Census-The NOAA whale biologist are on site to conduct the annual gray whale calf/cow census. They will probably be on site through the first week of June.

Staffing – Molly Nilsson is assisting with Atwell Island project possibly through the end of her internship (September). Summer intern Ivy Ku will be on site in June. Jodie Nelson will become a full time BLM employee in June upon graduation from Cal Poly.

Special event- Central Coast Lighthouse Conference, 4/27 & 4/28, San Simeon. Cape Hatteras presentation, Hearst Theater 4/27, 7 pm.
